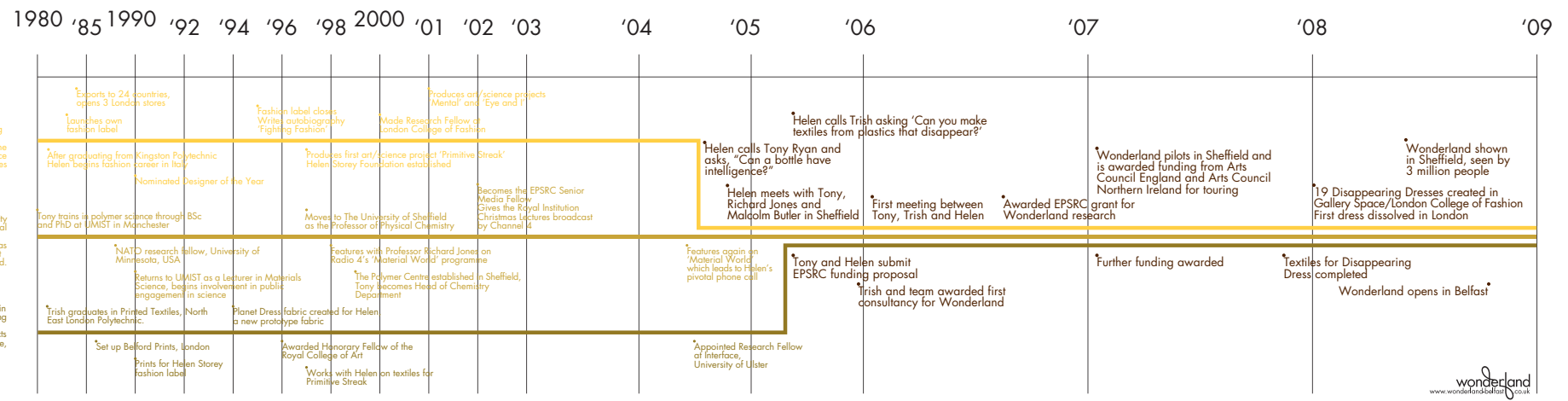

In the last decade Helen has produced 4 ambitious and global art/science collaborations, unearthing new ideas for a better world. She lives in London.

 is the Pro Vice-Chancellor for the Faculty of Science at the University of Sheffield where he was previously the ICI Professor of Physical Chemistry. He's written more than 200 scientific papers and a book on polymer processing.
